The Initiative reviewed existing School and Community Based Management Committee (S/CBMC) management guides to inform development of training manuals for SBMCs, CBMCs, Community Coalitions and women groups on school safety, support for early grade reading and monitoring of teaching and learning in schools and non-formal learning centers. Also reviewed were training materials on similar technical areas developed by other projects in Bauchi and Sokoto states to avoid duplication of effort and learn from best practices.

Highlights of the Week

- Conducted message development trainings for key staff in Abuja to introduce evidence-based messaging promoting access to education and the importance of early grade reading.
- Commenced the second round of cluster training of teachers on early grade reading program in schools using the *Mu Karanta!* (*Let's Read!*) pupil books and teacher guides in Bauchi and Sokoto states.
- Developed mentoring manual for Trainers of Teachers to coach and mentor 12,500 teachers teaching the early grade reading curriculum in schools in Bauchi and Sokoto states.
- Trained 10 Education Management Information System (EMIS) officers on collecting and tracking data for education indicators related to access and reading for efficient government systems in Sokoto state.
- Submitted comprehensive Year Two Work Plan to USAID to guide implementation of project activities in Bauchi and Sokoto states.
- Collected data from the Federal Ministry of Education and its agencies at national level to inform the State Education Accounts (SEAs). SEAs will provide financial evidence to aid decision making around allocating resources for basic education.
- Engaged 58 data enumerators to collect attendance and registration profiles for teachers who participated in the eight-day cluster training on early grade reading.
- Built capacity of LGEA EMIS officers to analyze Early Grade Reading Assessment (EGRA) data analysis.
