Pilot Early Grade Reading Course Begins in Colleges

The first Early Grade Reading course for student teachers in Nigeria developed by the National Commission for Colleges of Education and the Northern Education Initiative Plus is being piloted in Bauchi and Sokoto states. Colleges of Education benefitting from this program are College of

Education Kangare, Aminu Saleh College of Education, Abubakar Tatari Polytechnic in Bauchi State and Shehu Shagari College of Education, Sokoto State. The pilot Early Grade Reading Course introduces 200 student

teachers from Primary Education and Languages Departments to practical strategies required to teach reading methods and principles in lower primary schools. Students will take a thirteen-week course integrating the Let's Read! Mu Karanta! curricula implemented in schools in Bauchi and

Sokoto states. The program also provides opportunities for

teaching practice activities in schools. The Initiative, National Commission for Colleges of Education, Nigerian Educational Research and Development Council and the four Colleges of Education designed and developed the course for teachers. College administrators have been orientated and trained

Aminu Saleh College of Education started the pilot course on June 5, 2017 to finish instruction by September 1, 2017 and hold examinations by September 8, 2017. Abubakar Tatari Polytechnic and Shehu Shagari College of Education will start on June 26, 2017 finishing instruction by September 22, 2017 to have examinations by September 29, 2017.

20,000 Out-Of-School Children Pass Exams

to deliver the course content.

More than 90 percent of over 22,000 learners enrolled in 800 Non-Formal Learning Centers in Bauchi and Sokoto states have passed examinations rounding off a six-month non-formal education program introduced by the Initiative and State Agency for Mass Education. These learners will be provided certificates by the State Agencies

for Mass Education and have the opportunity to mainstream into **Primary** four in formal schools with support from the State Universal Basic

Education Board in Bauchi and Sokoto states. The Initiative opened these centers in different communities

bringing quality education to thousands of children who otherwise would not have access to schooling. Children between ages 5 to 17 attended classes for a minimum of

six hours every week, received textbooks and were taught literacy, numeracy and life skills to prepare them to be self-reliant in the future. A breakdown of the results indicates that in Bauchi State 11,914 (6041- Male, 5873- Female) students passed out of 12,259 that

Male, 5386- Female) students passed out of 10,680 who took the tests. Significant progress has been made to identify ways for these students to continue their education in formal school or post literacy level in non-formal education. All relevant actors in the
